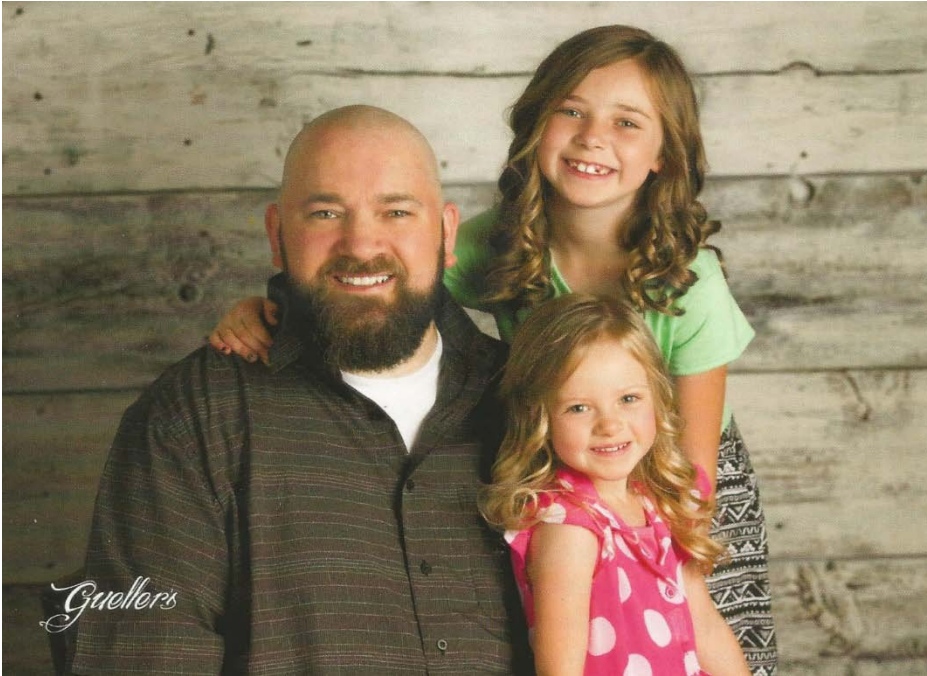


Praying For a Miracle for Ryan Mueller

We are begging God for a miracle through the intercession of Solanus Casey. Blessed Fr. Solanus Casey needs a miracle to advance his case for sainthood. We

are pleading that Ryan Mueller BE that miracle.



Ryan, the fifth of nine sons born to dairy farmers Bernard and Nancy Mueller of Marytown/New Holstein, is 42 years old. Ryan has worn many hats ranging from plumber to dog biscuit maker, mechanic to YMCA daycare. He graduated UW-Parkside with a BA in History and teaching. Ryan taught 2nd, 3rd, and 5th grades as well as 5th and 6th grade science.

In September 2010, Ryan was diagnosed with a meningioma brain tumor, resulting in four craniotomies and several rounds of radiation. In 2015, he was diagnosed with ALS. Due to his deteriorating health, he was forced to move back home and now resides with his parents. He is losing the use of his legs, arms, voice and lungs.

Ryan states that he has been given many blessings in his life. "Loving friends and family who fight WITH me on the good days, and FOR me on the bad. I have two beautiful daughters who are my everything. I am a firm believer in God's plan and I trust in Jesus. I pray for my health, to ease the burden on my parents, to repay those who have sacrificed for me in deed and prayer, and to be a guiding light for my daughters and those I contact."

Please join us in praying 3 consecutive novenas (nine day prayers) **beginning on July 5th** and **ending on July 31st**—the anniversary of Fr. Solanus's first Mass AND 53 years later to the day and hour, his death. Another big day, his ordination, was **July 24th** If you can only commit to one novena, count back 9 days from one of those dates.

Fr. Solanus often told people who asked for favors to do something that would bring about interior changes as well as the exterior favor being asked for. In the spirit of Blessed Solanus, strive to imitate God through his servant Solanus.

Day One

Fr. Solanus . struggled with his studies at the seminary. He was therefore ordained with limited powers. He could say Mass but not preach or hear confessions. Fr. Solanus humbly accepted the lowly jobs of sacristan and doorman of the monastery. *"The great challenge in life is not to find work that will fulfill us, but finding fulfillment in whatever work we are doing."* (Fr. Solanus)

Prayer (used each day): O God, I adore You. I give myself to You. May I be the person You want me to be, and may Your will be done in my life today.

I thank You for the gifts You gave to Father Solanus. If it is Your Will, bless us with the beatification of Venerable Solanus so that others may imitate and carry on his love for all the poor and suffering of our world.

As he joyfully accepted Your Divine plans, I ask You according to Your Will, to hear my prayer for Ryan Mueller through Jesus Christ our Lord. Thank you ahead of time. Amen.

Day Two

Fr. Solanus spent much time praying in front of the Blessed Sacrament. It is said that he would be so deep in prayer that he would not even notice others coming and going, lights illuminated and dimmed, etc. He made it a point to intercede for every person he welcomed at the door, and as his visitors increased so did his prayer time.

When his friends grew tired of his violin playing and singing, he would go to the chapel and play for his Friend in the Blessed Sacrament.

Day Eight

God often permits us to make temporal blunders in order to foster humility in our souls, so that in the sight of heaven we may be more amiable. Father Solanus understood that our mistakes in this life can help us in the next, by keeping us humble and not allowing us to look down on others. The next time you make a big blunder, smile to yourself, raise your eyes to Heaven, and thank God.

Day Nine

"God, who loves tiny beginnings, will know, as He always does know, how and when to provide development." (Bl. Solanus Casey)
Just as He multiplied the fishes and loaves to

feed thousands, so He can multiply our attempts at love, goodness and mercy. Today, make that attempt at forgiving, at loving. God will provide the rest.

Day Ten

"Man's greatness lies in being faithful to the present moment." (Fr. Solanus Casey) It must be moment by moment that we recognize God in our midst. Only then can we say with Fr. Solanus, *"What does it matter where we go? Because we will be serving God with each breath we take..."*

Day Fourteen

Our Christian Faith offers us no illusion that we are a People chosen for exemption from any form of pain and suffering. It holds no promise of a trouble-free life of easy comfort. It grants us no immunity from evil and its consequences. It makes no exception to the rule of God's judgment. Rather, our Christian Faith provides us with the spiritual equilibrium and the moral stamina and the endurance to face up to the burdens and the fears and the evil days that overtake us -- often in the most unexpected ways. With eyes of Christian Faith, we see things as they are in the light of things as they **will be**. And that's the key to overcoming worry: that we see things as they are: pain, sickness, financial stress, or any difficulty, in the light of things as they will be when He wipes away every tear (Revelation 21:4), and in the light of a loving God who walks with us through it all. (Deacon Bruce Burnham) To quote Fr. Solanus Casey further on worry:

"Keep courage—rather confidence in God—which is courage divinely reinforced."

God could have established his Church under supervision of angels that have no faults or weaknesses.
